You must show what you have learned about Alexander the Great. This assignment will improve your skill in discerning and summarizing his feats in phrase form along with using descriptive adjectives.

- Use p. 406-409, student-friendly websites, or the Ebsco database (OG library website) or ppf
- Words or partial words can be used either before or after (or both) letters in the acrostic poem
- Do not repeat ideas ("controlled the army" and "led the military" or "great general" and "amazing general")
- Explain unfamiliar terms (e.g., "Hellenistic")
- Select important facts (e.g., what he did, not what month he was born in)
- Phrases are more descriptive than single words
- Use verbs (e.g., "built hospital," not just "hospital")
- Avoid sentences that cover several lines (one fact per line)
- Stay on topic of Alexander the Great (e.g., don't mention how Greece was weak from the war)
- Show what you know; include locations and ages if you know them (not, "died at an old age" but "died at 82")
- Consult "George Washington" sample beloiw
