Less confusion; Unified the empire; Encouraged travel and trade because people knew what to expect in other city-states	Fewer arguments (everyone could know exactly what the law said)	No one could say they didn't know the laws	People were less likely to do the crime

The laws made it so that the same behavior had the same consequence	The laws protected people from certain behaviors	Government was in charge of making and enforcing laws.

Justice Equal treatment Fairness	People (including women and children) had rights. In other words, people had the right not to experience certain bad behaviors from others.	Rule of Law (not whim or vengeance) Protection Predictability Order
